Conflict History

- Civil War and conflict since independence in 1948
- Some of the longest running armed conflicts in the world
- 21 recognized armed groups, hundreds of militias
- 2011: Embarked on a series of reforms (e.g. political and economic reforms and ceasefire negotiations)
- Up to 2015, 17 bilateral ceasefire deals were signed
- 2015: Nationwide Ceasefire Agreement (NCA) signed with eight groups
- 2018: Two more groups signed the NCA



NCA implementation

- NCA mentions the partiers are responsible for demining of their own areas
- Level of trust is not in place between the government and ethnic armed signatory groups
- Northern part of the Country is still seeing active conflicts
- Functionality of resolving mechanisms between signatory groups and the government is feeble
- The political process has slowed down ethnic groups waiting for political results before moving on with security sector changes
- As a result no demining has started only MRE and limited survey



Current HMA possibilities

- Mine Risk Education and Victim Assistance is acknowledged and allowed by the government
- MRE and VA are acceptable in some of the former conflict affected areas
- This is quite a significant change in Myanmar not accepted until 2012





Why we conduct MRE

Does not solve the problem but it is valuable in itself as it raises awareness and helps avoid mine accidents





MRE as a trust building tool

- To gain access and to build trust with communities
- MRE is important to build trust with the armed groups
- It is a starting point for further discussions on HMA
- Community have a chance to address their issues and difficulties through MRE activities





Key messages from MRE

Although armed groups and the military often deny the presence of landmines or ERWs; useful evidence information can be collected through MRE activities.





Conclusion

- Humanitarian Mine Action is connected to Peace Process
- The political process need to progress for large scale humanitarian demining to take place
- MRE, VA and NTS are currently the entry points for trust building with armed groups and the military – will hopefully eventually lead to demining
